OUTING TO the Royal Burgh of Culross on Wednesday, 17 May 2017

The Royal Burgh of Culross is a unique example in Scotland of a township that has changed little since the seventeenth century. Much of the Burgh is owned by the National Trust for Scotland. St Mungo is said to have been born in Culross in the sixth century. It became an important centre of coal-mining and salt-making in the late sixteenth century and was created a royal burgh by James VI in 1588. The Palace was built by Sir George Bruce between 1597 and 1611.

Transport, admission charges and guided tours of the palace and burgh are included in the cost of £23 per person. We hope to make a coffee/comfort stop *en route*, details of which will follow.
